Az MTA Jubileumi Tudományünnep eseménysorozatának egyik állandó programszervezőjeként a Fiatal Kutatók Akadémiája idén november 12-én, szerdán 9:30-tól 16:30-ig tartja két félnapos rendezvényét az MTA Székház Dísztermében.

Délelőtt 9:30-tól 12:00-ig „*Multidiszciplináris kutatások, avagy hogyan találunk egymásra kutatási területek*” címmel hallgathatnak előadásokat az érdeklődők egymástól távol álló tudományterületek gyümölcsöző együttműködéséről, majd egy kerekasztal-beszélgetés nyújt lehetőséget a kötetlenebb eszmecserére. Szintén a délelőtti rendezvény során kerül majd sor – idén először – a Fekete Zoltán Fiatal Mentor Díjak átadására.

Délután 13:00 órától 16:30-ig, szintén az MTA Székház Dísztermében, az „ötödéves” FKA-tagok előadásaival folytatódik a program, akik saját szerteágazó kutatási területeikről fognak beszámolni, ismét bizonyosságot téve a Fiatal Kutatók Akadémiája tagságának sokszínűségéről. A rendezvény címe: „Bemutatkoznak az FKA tagjai – szakmai beszámolók a kutatási területükről”.

III. One Sustainable Health (OSH) for All Forum Lyon 2025

On the occasion of World One Health Day on November 3, Lyon will host the *One Sustainable Health for All Forum* from November 2 to 5, bringing together international experts in human, animal, and environmental health. The event will be organized by the One Sustainable Health for All Foundation, under the aegis of the Institut Pasteur, in synergy with all organizations involved in the international OSH preparatory conferences.

For four days, Lyon will become the capital of sustainable health, gathering field practitioners, researchers, leaders of NGOs, foundations, companies, and local as well as international institutions around a common goal: to align expertise and resources to operationalize the “*One Sustainable Health*” approach at the heart of the “*Health – Environment – Social*” nexus.

At the heart of the OSH Forum, experts engaged throughout the year in the 10 International Working Groups (IWGs) will share their recommendations on environmental health, sustainable food systems, education, financing models and governance, equitable access to health, the importance of data, as well as the challenges of sustainable health in urban settings and humanitarian contexts. They will agree on operational priorities to address today’s health, environmental, and social challenges.

Several OSH-labelled side events will also be organized to strengthen the community around One Sustainable Health and increase the visibility of OSH initiatives.

Organizers look forward to welcoming you in Lyon, or online, to jointly build—through a transdisciplinary and multi-stakeholder approach—new collaborative and inclusive pathways to tackle our health, environmental, and social challenges!

IV. Call for Experts: Ocean Observations Physics and Climate Panel

The Ocean Observations Physics and Climate Panel (OOPC), a scientific expert advisory group to the Global Ocean (GOOS) and Global Climate (GCOS) Observing Systems and the World Climate Research Program (WCRP), is seeking new experts to serve on the panel.

OOPC is in charge of assessing the capabilities, gaps and deficiencies of current ocean physics/climate observing systems. The panel also helps to improve the observing capabilities by encouraging the development of strategies for the ocean observing system evaluation and evolution. In addition, it contributes to the regular reports to the UNFCCC about the status of global climate-observing capacities.

Panel members are tasked with:

- Maintaining and periodically reviewing the list of GOOS Essential Ocean Variables (EOVs) and GCOS Essential Climate Variables (ECVs).
- Specifying and reviewing requirements for sustained ocean observations.
- Reviewing the current state and identify gaps and inadequacies of the global ocean observing system.
- Working on strategies for developing and improving the sustained ocean observing system, including harnessing new technologies.
- Helping in promoting the establishment of sustainable observation networks and the use of best practices.

The panel interacts through the year by videoconference (one 2 hours-long meeting every 2-3 months), by email, and once every 18 months in person. Financial support for attending meetings will be provided. Members are initially appointed for a 3-year term, with the possibility of an extension for a further 3 years.

XI. Report on Exploratory Webinar on the Potential of Rapid Evidence Synthesis for Environmental Action

On 26 June 2025, Science Europe and its partner organisations organised a webinar on '*The Potential of Rapid Evidence Synthesis for Environmental Action*'.

The event brought together leading experts in science–policy interfaces, environmental research, and evidence synthesis for a timely discussion on how rapid and living approaches to synthesising scientific evidence can support environmental action and strengthen the science–policy interface.

Speakers explored how rapid evidence synthesis (RES) can help decision-makers access usable, actionable, and timely scientific knowledge to inform environmental policies. The discussion addressed lessons learned from other fields where RES has been successfully implemented, the use of artificial intelligence in evidence synthesis, and the prerequisites for deploying such approaches effectively in environmental contexts.

This report summarises the outcomes of these discussions and highlights the potential for research organisations to play a stronger role in connecting science and policy to accelerate action on pressing environmental challenges such as climate change, pollution, and biodiversity loss.

The insights gathered during the webinar contribute to Science Europe's broader work to enhance the role of science in addressing societal challenges and to promote sustainability within the research system.
